COMMAND SUPPORT TEAM RELATIONSHIPS

INTRODUCTION:

The operational readiness of a command not only depends on a strong military but also on the support of family members. The Command Support Team (CST) can be an invaluable resource to other spouses of deployed service members. The CST is comprised of the spouses of the Commanding Officer (CO), Executive Officer (XO) and Command Master Chief/Chief of the Boat (CMC/COB), the Ombudsman and when available, the chaplain. This module explores how the CST, through effective leadership, can enhance the morale of the command family through sharing resources and positive social interaction.

The goal of this module is to:

- understand the composition and role of the CST
- discuss the interaction between the Family Readiness Group (FRG) and the CST
- interaction between the CST and the Ombudsman

IDEAS FOR TEAMBUILDING SUGGESTIONS FOR NEW CMC/COB SPOUSES

Check-in List

During the first two weeks following your arrival at the command:

- 1. Contact the CO Spouse and XO Spouses
 - · phone or email is preferable
 - schedule a "coffee date" to meet personally
- 2. Accompany spouse when visiting base resources:
 - Chaplain
 - Fleet and Family Support Center
 - Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society
 - Public Affairs Office
 - ISIC (Immediate Superior in Command) Command Master Chief
- 3. Obtain a social roster and/or recall list from the command
- 4. Make a personal telephone call to other spouses in the chief's mess
- 5. Set up meetings with:
 - Ombudsman
 - Family Readiness Group (FRG) board or leader
- 6. Make contact with the local Senior Enlisted spouse group

Check-out List

Prior to leaving the command:

- 1. Meet with new CMC/COB couple
 - invite them to dinner
 - share information (chief's mess traditions for hail and farewell gifts)
 - make a turnover notebook to include:
 - social roster
 - leadership roster (spouses of CO and XO) (Ombudsman, FRG officers)
 - o list of local resources (people and places)
 - local spouse organizations
- 2. Introduce new CMC/COB spouse to other spouses and FRG as feasible at hail and farewell/FRG meeting
- 3. Provide thank you gifts for Ombudsman, CO and XO spouses
- 4. Be gracious, be thankful and be gone!
