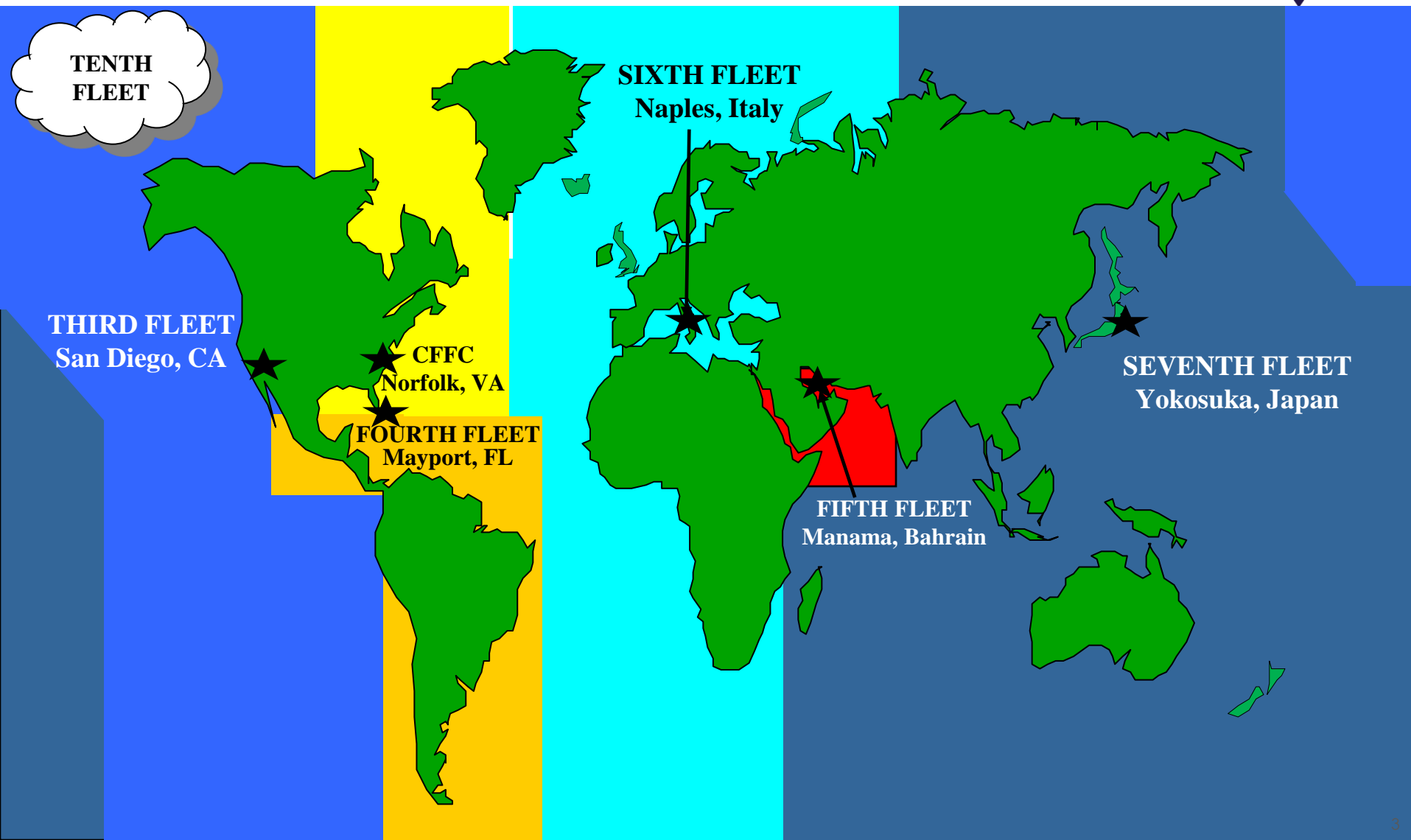

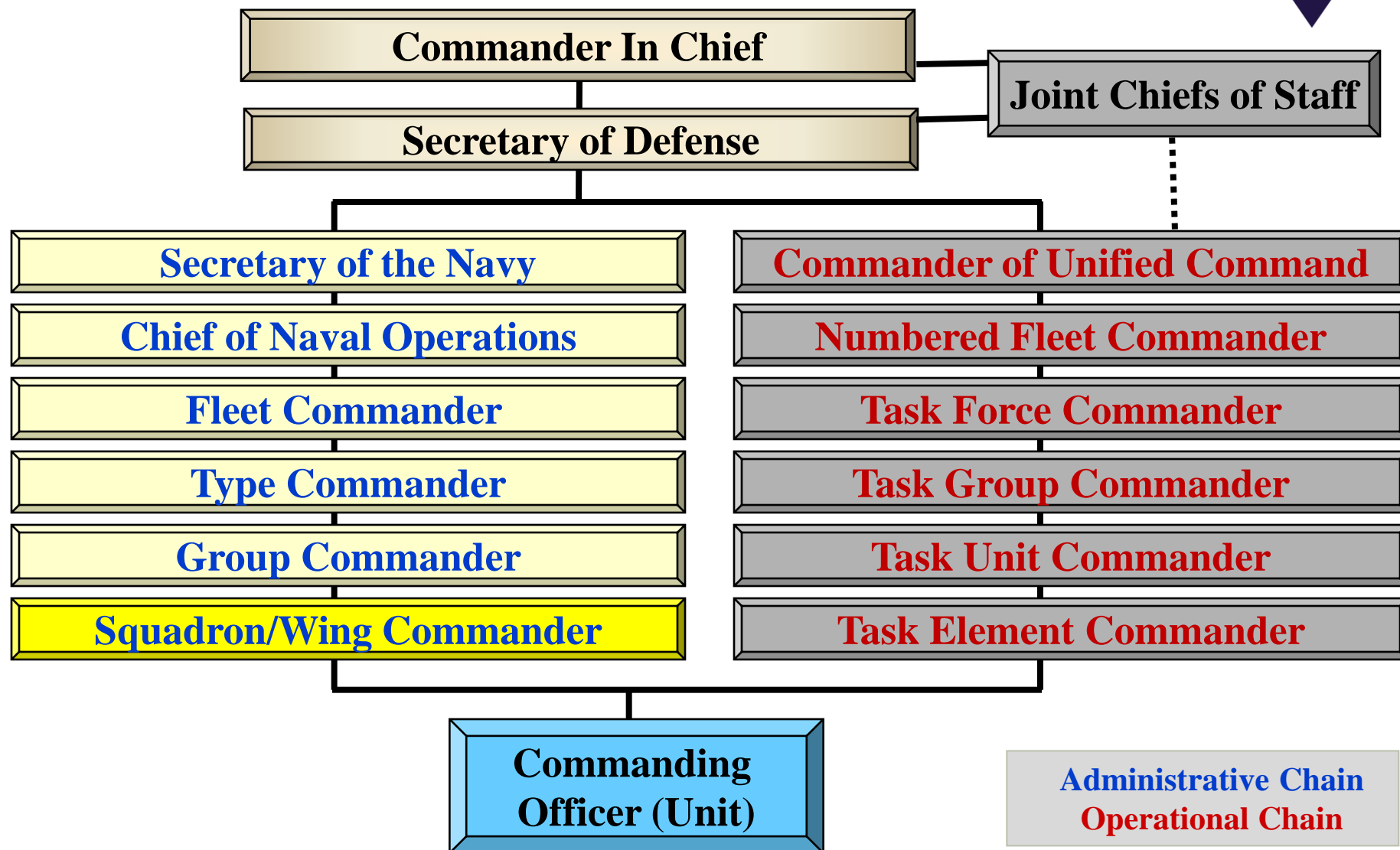

Geographic Responsibility for Deployed Forces



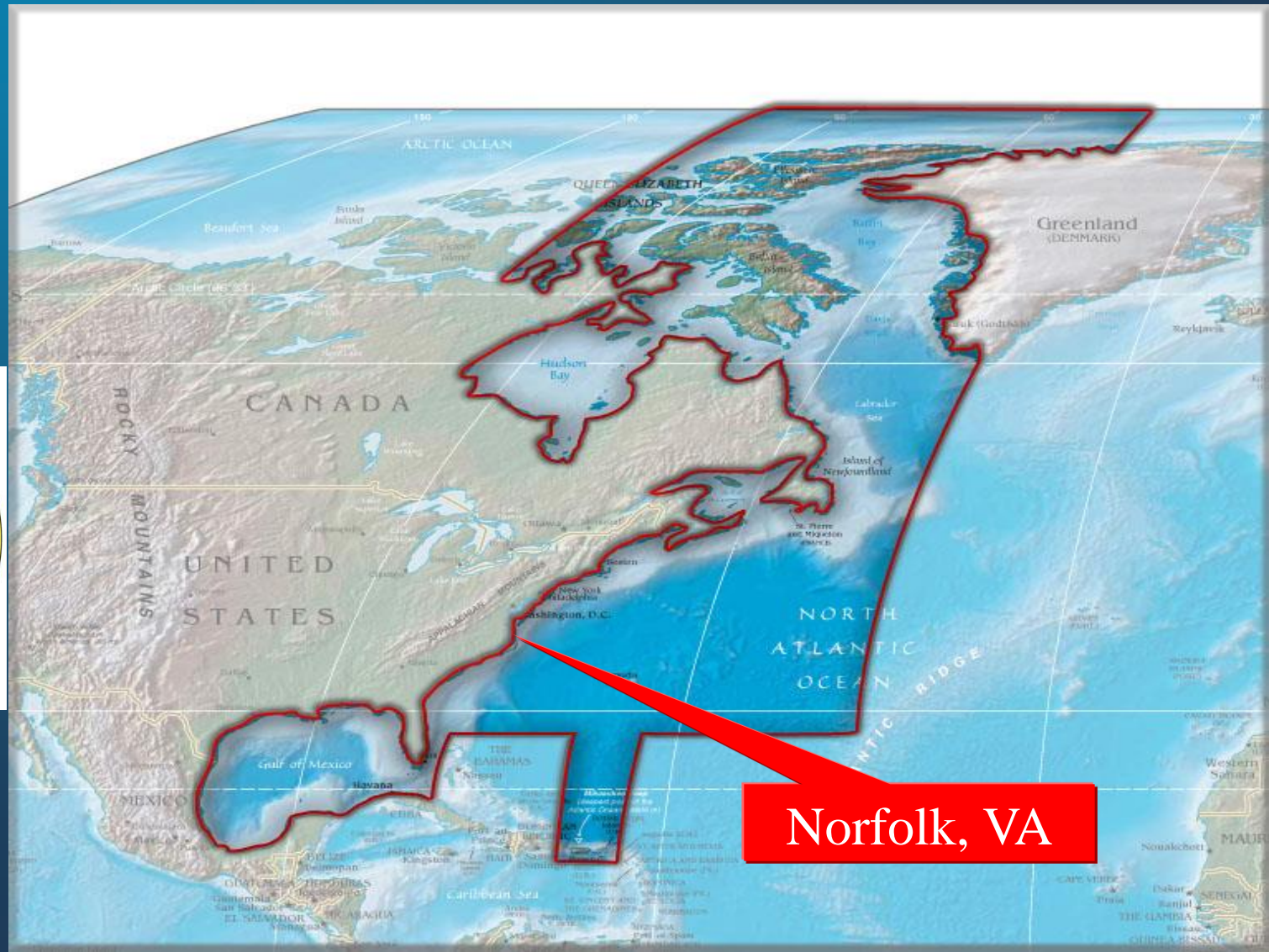


Chain of Command

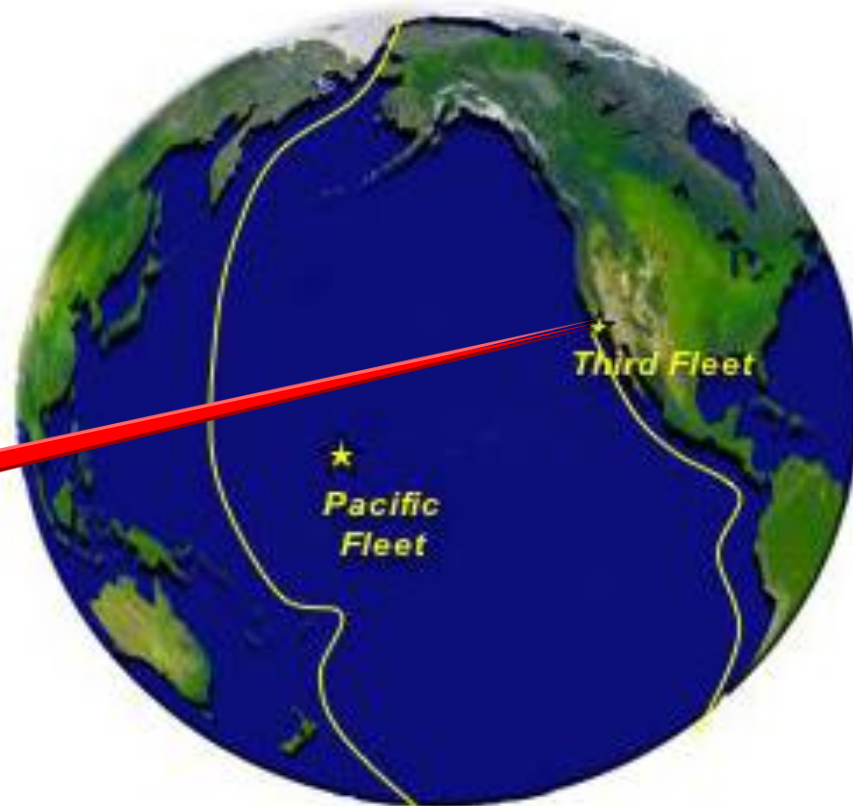

1941 – 1945: U.S. 10th Fleet was the lead for anti-submarine warfare in charge of protecting Allied merchant vessels and military convoys and against German U-Boats in the Atlantic.



Currently: 10th Fleet maintains operational control of Navy cyber forces to execute the full spectrum of computer network operations, cyber warfare, electronic warfare, information operations and signal intelligence capabilities and missions across the cyber, electromagnetic and space domains.
